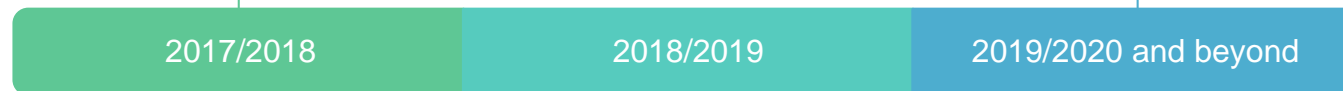

What lowering the barriers to MAT care means

- Walk-in Admissions
- Hiring more Bi-lingual staff
- Providing in-person & telehealth counseling services
- Providing Tele-med services (follow up appointments)
- Multiple dispensing windows – expanding medication dispensing
- Extended dispensing hours
- Focusing on providing more case management and referrals
- Proving Financial assistance

What lowering the barriers to MAT care means: cont.


- Psychiatric consultations - complex medical/behavioral needs
- Transportation assistance to the clinic and medical appointments
- Criminal justice – Jail buprenorphine inductions
- Criminal justice – MAT maintenance in jail no matter what county the inmate resides in
- ED bridge – working with Marin General Hospital to provide MAT at the ED level
- Providing more Team Meetings for patient support

Outreach, training, consultation, MAT expertise, criminal justice and collaboration



- We continue to provide buprenorphine X-Waiver trainings locally and throughout Northern California, including to our local emergency room providers
- Provide ongoing technical support to providers new to buprenorphine prescribing locally, including helping to coordinate care between detox, ERs, and MTC
- Develop protocol and run point on requests for buprenorphine continuations in Marin County Jail


Outreach, training, consultation, MAT expertise, criminal justice and collaboration cont.

- Provide consultation to MTC and other MAT providers on complex clients with co-occurring mental health, medical, and SUD needs
- Provide further community education re: SUD and MAT for stigma reduction
- Coordinate with Marin County Public Health Dept on efforts to identify and outreach to individuals who have experienced non-fatal overdoses



A strategic focus: sustainability 2020/2021 and beyond

- Increase our MAT services to Medicare beneficiaries – Medicare Senior Advantage, and traditional Medicare
 - Working more with patients with Co-occurring (pain & OUD)
 - Renegotiating private health insurance contracts to at least Medicare rates
 - Working with criminal justice to provide more MAT to the county jail inmates, including more Buprenorphine inductions
 - Address methamphetamine addiction in our MAT program – start providing contingency management outpatient program services
