

OPIOIDS IN THE BODY

Opioid receptors are located in the brain, brain stem, spinal cord, intestines and other organs. When endorphins, our body's naturally made opioids, are released or when opioid drugs are taken, they bind to opioid receptors in the brain and body to regulate functions including pain, pleasure, breathing and digestion.

Click on the body part to learn about the effects of opioids on that system. Then click Next.





Outcomes

- 587 out of 612 eligible students from Podiatry and Osteopathic Schools completed the curriculum
- Pretest conducted before curriculum
- Post-test conducted after 10 modules
- Attitudinal scores before, during and after using Visual Analog Scale (VAS)
- Pre-test mean was 3.59. Post-test was 6.78
- Initial VAS mean -26.97; Final VAS mean -39.27
