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

#### PTSD and SUD

- ▶ Often co-occur
- Approximately 46.4% of individuals with PTSD have co-occurring SUD
- One study found that 36.6% of individuals with SUD have PTSD
- ▶ 97.4% of individuals with SUD have experienced a traumatic event



#### Review of Stressors



**TOLERABLE** 



- ▶ 3 types of stressors
  - ▶ Positive → helping to guide growth
  - ►Tolerable → not helpful, but not causing lasting harm
  - ►Toxic → sufficient to overcome one's coping mechanisms and lead to long-term impairment



## Adverse Childhood Experiences Study (ACE)



- Ongoing collaborative research between the CDC and Kaiser Permanente
- Over 17,000 Kaiser patients participating in routine health screening volunteered to participate in the study
- Examined data from over 17,000 participants
  - ► 50% men, 50% women
  - ► 80% White, 10% Black, 10% Asian
  - ▶ 74% had been to college




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#### Major Findings of the ACE Study

- ACEs such as childhood abuse, neglect, and exposure to other traumatic stressors are common
- ► Almost two-thirds of the ACE Study participants reported at least one ACE, and more than one of five reported three or more ACE
- ► The short- and long-term outcomes of these childhood exposures include a multitude of health and social problems


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## The ACE Study


28% of women and 16% of men report having experienced childhood sexual abuse

66% of people in substance abuse treatment report childhood abuse or neglect

90% of women with alcohol dependence reported childhood sexual abuse or severe physical abuse

#### ACEs and Opioid Use Disorders

- ► Individuals who reported 5 or more ACEs were 3x more likely to misuse prescription pain medicines
- ► Among individuals seeking treatment for opioid use issues, nearly half reported 4 or more ACEs (compared to 15% of the general population)
- ▶ Age of initiation, ongoing intravenous drug use, and lifetime experience of overdose were all associated with ACEs in a graded, dose-response relationship

#### High Rates of Comorbid PTSD and SUD Indicate Two Common Development Pathways

#### Substance Use

- Risk-taking behaviors
- Escalation in drug-seeking behaviors
- Increased arousal, anxiety and sensitivity to neurobiological stress system


PTSD

#### **PTSD**

- Need to self-medicate
- Use substances that produce an arousal/depressant effect consistent with symptoms of PTSD

Substance Use

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#### The ACE Score - Risk for Health Problems

- Alcoholism and alcohol abuse
- Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD)
- Depression
- Fetal death
- Health-related quality of life
- Illicit drug use
- Ischemic heart disease (IHD)
- Liver disease
- Risk for intimate partner violence

- Multiple sexual partners
- Sexually transmitted diseases (STDs)
- Smoking
- Suicide attempts
- Unintended pregnancies
- Early initiation of smoking
- Early initiation of sexual activity
- Adolescent pregnancy
