
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
Description

Increasing MAT Outreach, Engagement & Enrolments in our Native American Communities

PLAN

- Increase MAT enrollment of Native American population in areas with high overdose rates, specifically Hoopa Valley and Willow Creek.
- Invite tribal members to participate in our Patient Advocacy & Advisory Committee.

DO


- Participate in COBD (community outreach) events in Hoopa & Willow Creek
- Pair with spoke K'ima:w Medical Center to increase referrals and reduce barriers to treatment.
- Distribute Harm Reduction Supplies (Narcan and Fentanyl Test Strips in Hoopa and Willow Creek).

STUDY

 Evaluate numbers of enrollment for Native American population after increasing engagement in Hoopa and Willow Creek area.

ACT

 Meet with community members to discuss successes and continuing barriers to treatment so that barriers can be addressed. Learn what is most effective; tabling at events, one on one communication with potential patients, referrals from our spoke, distributing harm reduction supplies etc.
